Guiding Questions

1 - Factual Questions

- a) What do you understand by the term *curriculum*?

- **c)** What advantages does a curriculum based around concepts have over a curriculum based around facts and topics?

2 - Conceptual Questions

- a) Why is it important for teachers to understand the fundamental nature of their own discipline, and why is it important for teachers to convey this information to their students?
- **b)** Why is it important for teachers and students to recognise connections between different disciplines?
- c) What skills do your students need for the future? What careers do you predict they will be pursuing in 20 years' time? What will prepare them for these careers?

3 - Controversial / Debatable / Provocative Questions

- a) What are the possible long-term consequences if schools do not encourage their students to make connections between different disciplines?
- b) "Students learn less about individual disciplines (disciplinarity) if they are spending time in class making interdisciplinary connections." Give reasons as to why you agree or disagree with this statement.
- **c)** Why is it often difficult for schools to implement a new curriculum model or pedagogical practice?
